1. SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

1.1. Electrical Safety

WARNING! It is the user's responsibility to read, understand and comply with the following:

You must check all electrical equipment and appliances to ensure they are safe before using.
You must inspect power supply leads, plugs and all electrical connections for wear and damage.

You must ensure the risk of electric shock is minimised by the installation of appropriate safety devices. An RCCB (Residual Current Breaker) should be incorporated in the main distribution board. We also recommend that an RCD (Residual Current Device) is used with all electrical products. It is particularly important to use an RCD with portable products that are plugged into an electrical supply not protected by an RCCB. If in doubt consult a qualified electrician. You may obtain a Residual Current Device by contacting your Sealey dealer. **You must** also read and understand the following instructions concerning electrical safety.

1.1.1. The Electricity At Work Act 1989 requires all portable electrical appliances, if used on business premises, to be tested by a qualified electrician, using a Portable Appliance Tester (PAT), at least once a year.

1.1.2. The Health & Safety at Work Act 1974 makes owners of electrical appliances responsible for the safe condition of the appliance and the safety of the appliance operator. If in doubt about electrical safety, contact a qualified electrician.

1.1.3. Ensure the insulation on all cables and the product itself is safe before connecting to the mains power supply. See 1.1.1. & 1.1.2. above and use a Portable Appliance Tester (PAT).

1.1.4. Ensure that cables are always protected against short circuit and overload.

1.1.5. Regularly inspect power supply leads and plugs for wear and damage and all electrical connections to ensure that none is loose.

1.1.6. Important: Ensure the voltage marked on the product is the same as the electrical power supply to be used and check that plugs are fitted with the correct capacity fuse. A 13 amp plug may require a fuse smaller than 13 amps for certain products, see fuse rating below.

1.1.7. **DO NOT** pull or carry the appliance by the power supply lead.

1.1.8. **DO NOT** pull power plugs from sockets by the power cable.

1.1.9. **DO NOT** use worn or damaged leads, plugs or connections. Immediately replace or have repaired by a qualified electrician. A U.K. 3 pin plug with ASTA/BS approval is fitted. In case of damage, cut off and fit a new plug according to the following instructions, discard old plug safely (UK only - see diagram at right). Ensure the unit is correctly earthed via a three-pin plug.

- Connect the green/yellow earth wire to the earth terminal 'E'.
- Connect the brown live wire to live terminal 'L'.
- Connect the blue neutral wire to the neutral terminal 'N'.

After wiring, check that there are no bare cores, that all wires have been correctly connected, that the cable external insulation extends beyond the cable restraint and that the restraint is tight.

Double insulated products are fitted with live (BROWN) and neutral (BLUE) wires only. Double insulated products are always marked with this symbol . Check your model carefully to see which type of product you have. To rewire a double insulated item, connect the brown and blue wires as indicated above. **DO NOT** connect brown or blue to the earth terminal.

1.1.10. Cable extension reels. When a cable extension reel is used it should be fully unwound before connection. A cable reel with an RCD fitted is recommended since any product which is plugged into the cable reel will be protected. The section of the cores of the cable is important and should be at least 1.5mm², but to be absolutely sure that the capacity of the cable reel is suitable for this product and for others that may be used in the other output sockets, we recommend the use of 2.5mm² section cable.

1.2. General Safety


WARNING! Ensure Health & Safety, local authority, and general work shop practice regulations are adhered to when using this equipment.

WARNING! Disconnect from mains power before changing accessories or servicing.

- ✓ Maintain the sander in good condition (use an authorised service agent).
- ✓ Replace or repair damaged parts. Use genuine parts only.

Unauthorised parts may be dangerous and will invalidate the warranty.

- ✓ Use sander in a suitable work area. Keep area clean, tidy and free from unrelated materials. Ensure that there is adequate lighting.
- ✓ Before use, check abrasive pad condition. If worn or damaged replace immediately.
- ☐ **WARNING!** Always wear approved eye or face protection when operating the sander.
- ✓ If dust is generated, use face, dust, or respiratory protection in accordance with COSHH regulations.
- ✓ Depending on use, sander noise level may exceed 85dB - in which case wear safety ear defenders.
- ✓ Remove ill fitting clothing, ties, watches, rings, other loose jewellery and contain and/or tie back long hair.
- ✓ Wear appropriate protective clothing and keep hands and body clear of moving parts.
- ✓ Maintain correct balance and footing. Ensure the floor is not slippery and wear non-slip shoes.
- ✓ Keep children and unauthorised persons away from the work area.
- ✓ Always use the sander with the side handle securely screwed in.
- ✓ Ensure the workpiece is correctly secured before operating the sander. Never hold workpiece by hand and check the workpiece to ensure there are no protruding nails, screws, rivets, etc.
- ✓ Avoid unintentional starting.
- ✓ When using the dust free version (DAS150T/DFS.V3) switch off the sander before you switch off the dust collection system.
- x **DO NOT** use the sander for a task it is not designed to perform.
- x **DO NOT** operate sander if any parts are damaged or missing. This may cause failure and/or injury.
- ☐ **WARNING! DO NOT** sand any materials containing asbestos.
- x **DO NOT** carry the sander by the electrical cable, or, in the case of DAS150T/DFS, the dust hose.
- x **DO NOT** connect DAS150T/DFS.V3 to a standard vacuum cleaner to extract dust as damage to the cleaner may result.
- x **DO NOT** get the sander wet or use in damp or wet locations.
- x **DO NOT** use sander with water, the sander is for dry use only.
- x **DO NOT** operate sander if you are tired or under the influence of alcohol, drugs or intoxicating medication.
- x **DO NOT** use where there are flammable liquids, solids or gases such as paint solvents or waste wiping or cleaning rags.
- x **DO NOT** leave the sander running unattended.
- x **DO NOT** carry the sander with your finger on the power switch.
- ✓ When not in use disconnect from power supply and store in a safe, dry, childproof area.

The DAS150T.V3 & DAS150/DFS.V3 Dual Action Sanders, when operated in accordance with these instructions and tested in accordance with EN 28662-2: 1994 results in the following vibration emission declared in accordance with BS EN ISO 8662-4:1995, ISO 8662-4:1994

Measured vibration emission value: 21.15m/s²

Uncertainty: 29.61m/s²

These values are suitable for comparison with emission levels of other tools that have been subject to the same test. This tool may cause hand-arm vibration syndrome if its use is inadequately managed. Recommended Measures to reduce risk of hand-arm vibration syndrome: This tool should not be used by an individual regularly for more than 13.69 minutes in any 8 hour period. This duration of use should be reduced if the individual is exposed to hand-arm vibration from other sources.

LEAD PAINT WARNING!

Paint once contained lead as a traditional ingredient. The dust from the removal of such paint is toxic if inhaled or ingested and must, therefore, be avoided. The following action must be taken before using the sander on a surface that you suspect may have contained lead in the paint.

- User must determine potential hazard relating to age of paint to be removed. (Modern paints do not contain lead).
- DANGER!** Keep all persons and pets away from the work area. The following are particularly vulnerable to the effects of lead paint dust: *Expectant women, babies and children.*
- We recommend personal protection by using the following safety items:
 - Paint Spray Respirator (Sealey ref: SSP16EN)
 - PE Coated Hooded Coverall (Sealey ref: SSP266)
 - Latex Gloves (Sealey ref: SSP24)
- Take adequate measures to contain the paint dust, flakes, and scrapings.
- Continue to wear safety equipment as in 3 above, and thoroughly clean all areas when task is complete. Ensure that paint waste is disposed of, in sealed bags or containers, according to local authority regulations.



2. ASSEMBLY & SPECIFICATIONS

The DAS150T.V3 and DAS150T/DFS.V3 have alloy gear housings and composite motor housings. Both units have slider On/Off switches with power lock. Discs and pads for DAS150T/DFS have holes through which dust is extracted. This unit must be connected to a dust extraction system. Contact your Sealey dealer for details. **DO NOT use a standard vacuum cleaner to extract dust as damage to the cleaner may result.**

2.1. Assembly

WARNING! DO NOT plug sander into the mains power supply before it is fully assembled.

Unpack the sander and check contents against figure 1. The contents should include a spanner and hex key. Should there be any damaged or missing parts contact your supplier immediately. Screw handle (2) into the hole (right or left side, as required) in the head. Screw the sanding pad onto the spindle (3). To remove pad, hold spindle with the spanner supplied whilst unscrewing the pad. The Hex key is for removal of the eccentric shaft for cleaning etc. and is inserted at point (4).

- 4.5. rear cover back into place and retain it with the screw. All other service and maintenance must be carried out by an authorised service agent.



3. OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

WARNING! Before use, ensure that you have read and understood Section 1 Safety Instructions.

- 3.1. Attach the correctly rated sanding disc (not supplied) to the sanding pad.
- 3.2. Plug the sander into the mains power supply.
- 3.3. Grip the side handle and turn on by pushing switch (fig 1.1) forward. Let go of the switch and the machine will continue running.
- 3.4. To release the switch, and stop the sander, press down on the rear section of the switch - it will spring to the Off position.
- 3.5. Check that the unit is working correctly before use.

Note: The sander is designed for dry use only. **DO NOT** use with water or any other liquids.

4. MAINTENANCE

WARNING! Disconnect sander from power supply before changing accessories, servicing or performing maintenance. Replace or repair any damaged parts. Use genuine parts only, unauthorised parts may be dangerous and will invalidate the warranty.

- 4.1. After each 50 hours use (or as required), remove dust by blowing air through the side vents and around the pad bearing. Periodic cleaning will prolong machine life.
- 4.2. Change pads when required. Ensure pad and disc RPM ratings are equal to, or exceed the machine rating. If the disc becomes unbalanced, it will cause the bearings to wear.
- 4.3. When not in use store in a safe, dry, childproof location.




fig. 3



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

- 4.4. Check brushes every 200 hours of use. To access the brushes refer to fig.3. Undo the screw in the end of the motor casing (1) and slide back the cover (2). Using a small screwdriver lift the brush spring to one side (3) and slide the brush out of its holder (4). If the brush is worn to half of its original length it should be renewed. Using thin nosed pliers pull the brush connector off its terminal (5). Slide the new brush into its holder. Slide the connector onto the terminal (5). Position the spring so that it bears down onto the end of the brush. Remember to renew brushes as a pair. Slide
