
# Trendsetter

Mark Baker tries the new
Trend Air/Pro Airshield
Pro Respirator on for size to
see how it shapes up in
the workshop



ere's the dilemma: whether to cover your entire face with a respirator, feel claustrophobic and risk 'Darth Vader' cracks from your mates, or to look cooler and more comfortable in an ordinary mask and risk inhaling fine and possibly toxic dust along with assault by flying wood chips.

Not so much of a dilemma after all is it, put like that!

So if we take it as a given that a fullface respirator will do what it says on the box, we are left with the gurning pals and our own personal comfort zone. I have to admit that, while I wear a respirator for safety's sake, up until now, I have never relished the prospect of donning it.

I own – and use – the Airshield model that the 230V Air/Pro Airshield Pro Respirator replaces, so am I going to get a positive wearing experience from this new one? I'm looking for comfort, health and efficiency at a reasonable price.

### IN USE

With the battery, motor, face shield and head guard sitting effectively on top of your head, the old-style respirators – of which the last Airshield was just one – could cause such a neck ache and feeling of being closed in that after a couple of hours, I always felt like removing the face shield and abandoning the job. But this new Airshield is light years away from



its predecessor. The balance is better, I was able to work for four hours without neck fatigue, and could have gone on for longer. There's a feeling of more space inside it and an impression of more air blowing across the face. It's a massive improvement on the old version and one of the least expensive PPE (personal protective equipment) respirators available today. In terms of value for money and performance, I wouldn't hesitate to give this product a full five out of five stars with four out of five for build quality.

The Airshield is sold with an 8-hour battery, charger, pair of THP2 fine filters, an airflow indicator, clear visor overlay and a handy storage case. RC
