# **Trend T11e router**

It may have been around a few years but Anthony Bailey can see why the T11 is Trend's flagship router

he Trend T11 has been with us for a while and has evolved gradually under various badges starting with the legendary but defunct ELU brand. So how does this machine stand up against much more recent and innovative machines?

## At first glance

It is an example of good basic engineering. It looks and feels built to last and able to take plenty of knocks. Similar to the T10, it has full electronic speed control including soft start and has a geared depth-setting rod which

acts on a click-stopped three-stage turret. Crucially, the plunge columns both slide through phosphor-bronze bushes for accurate smooth plunging.

Another feature, rare on routers nowadays, is a device for centring guidebushes on the cutter axis. The side fence has long removable rods which allows the use of a second fence for mortising. The on-off switch is the original flick up-and-

down pattern that works very well.

system, a quick-release dust spout and a larger 70mm-capacity cutter-diameter capability. However, the thing that makes this router really useful is the Quick Raiser detachable fine-height adjuster.

When I say detachable it is just that: no laborious screwing or unscrewing required because it just lifts off. It can be fitted in either freehand or table mode, a simple drilling being required in the standard Trend table insert plate to access it from above the table. The idea isn't new, being first seen on the Router Raizer from the US, but here it is an inbuilt feature that makes accurate adjustments quick and very precise. Fac
